Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of ARAPL RAAS Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at 31st March 2022, and the statement of profit and loss and statement of cash flows for the period from 17th October 2021 to 31st March 2022, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2022, and its profit/loss and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

In preparing the financial statements, the Board of Directors is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

 conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report.

The financial statements/information of these branches have been audited by the branch auditors whose reports have been furnished to us, and our opinion in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these branches, is based solely on the report of such branch auditors.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

 - (f) Since the Company's turnover as per last audited financial statements is less than Rs. 50 Crores and its borrowings from banks and financial institutions at any time during the year is less than Rs. 25 Crores, the Company is exempted from getting an audit opinion with respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls over financial reporting of the company and the operating effectiveness of such controls vide notification dated June 13, 2017;

29 Significant Accounting Policies

29 Method of Accounting

The accounts of the Company are prepared in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India. The Company has maintained its accounts on mercantile system of accounting.
